

2017 Pre-College Architecture Scholarship Guidelines

Eligibility

Students must formally apply to the Pre-College Architecture program by submitting an application ([click here to apply](#)) in order to be considered for a scholarship. The deadline for the admission application is April 25, 2017. Once a student has been admitted to the Architecture program, they are eligible to complete the scholarship application for consideration (second page of this document). Please note: only one scholarship may be awarded per student and the scholarship is only for a partial amount. Scholarships are not available for international students.

Submission Requirements

Scholarship applications are reviewed on a rolling basis through April 25, 2017. Applications can be submitted as soon as students **have been admitted into the program**. Please complete the scholarship application on the second page of this document **and** the Financial Estimate ([click here and follow the instructions listed on the financial estimate form](#)). Scholarship applications must include:

- Application Form
- Completion of the Financial Estimate
- Short Answer Questions
- Creative Work Examples

All pages must include applicant's name.

Short Answer Questions

Answer all four of the short answer questions in no more than 1000 words total. You may choose to answer each question in approximately 250 words each, or may have responses that are shorter for some questions and longer for others so long as your responses do not exceed 1000 words total. Each page must include your name.

- Describe your access to and participation in cultural and/or creative activities.
- Identify two questions you hope to answer for yourself by participating in this program and describe why they are important to you.
- How would you be an asset to the Carnegie Mellon Pre-College Architecture Program?
- Why are you the best candidate for a scholarship?

Creative Work Examples

Submit three to five examples of creative work. Any creative work from school, extracurricular classes, or independent work may be included; this may include photography, drawing, ceramics, models, or any other creative work. Images (scans, photographs) of samples should be submitted digitally; each page should be formatted to 8.5x11 and should include your name and page number. Submissions should be at least three pages (one page minimum for each example) but must not exceed ten pages. Please see details for submission on page two (or reverse side) of this form.

Other important information

All scholarship awards are final and cannot be appealed.

Deposit of \$200 and/or any remaining balances are due by May 15, 2017. Payments made after this date could result in the loss of an awarded scholarship.
